What should I expect?

1. A pharmacy technician from Tarrytown Pharmacy, will call you in the next 48 business hours.
 - You will be asked if you have any new medications and verify all existing medications.
 - You will then setup an in-home visit with a Tarrytown pharmacist and answer any questions or concerns at that moment under the guidance of Dr. Ching.
2. Dr. Ching, or another Tarrytown pharmacist, will meet with you at your Westminster residence within 7 – 14 days after discharge. The consultation should help you feel at ease with your medication regimen.
3. A technician will follow up with a phone call 1 – 2 weeks after your visit with Dr. Ching to assure that you feel well taking the new medications and you have any necessary refills.

What should I know about the medication consultation?

Tarrytown Pharmacy is working with the Westminster health care team to provide a medication consultation after a hospital visit, *regardless of where you fill your prescriptions*. The goal of the consultation is to help you feel comfortable and confident in managing your medications, reduce unwanted side effects, and let your health care team know the most up-to-date information about your medications.

Why is this important?

A best practice after a hospital visit is a medication review. It is important that you are informed about your current medications when you get home from the hospital. Findings from the medication review will be communicated with your health care team.
